Use the theme for the first of these issues that was already in place, book challenges and book bans. Theme for second issue I'm editing is mental health for teens. The Board has approved both themes. We will meet about the other issues' themes within two-three weeks.

I did not get any proposals after the CFP was published on the blog. I pushed the deadline back two weeks, to May 15 from May 1. Board members are now reaching out to their contacts to see if anyone is interested in contributing to this important issue. I have also contacted several friends who are interested and concerned about the current spike in challenges and bans, and may be interested in writing about them. I will continue to reach out to ALA groups to see if they are interested.

I must confess that after talking to Yolanda and others, I was under the impression that sending out the CFP would result in enough responses to fill an issue. Obviously, I was naïve in that belief, and I will approach the process of acquiring articles very differently in the future.

I plan to be at the Annual Conference, and will be attending programs and contacting people who might be interested in contributing to the journal. I will continue to work with the current Board members, and hope to welcome new members in the future.
